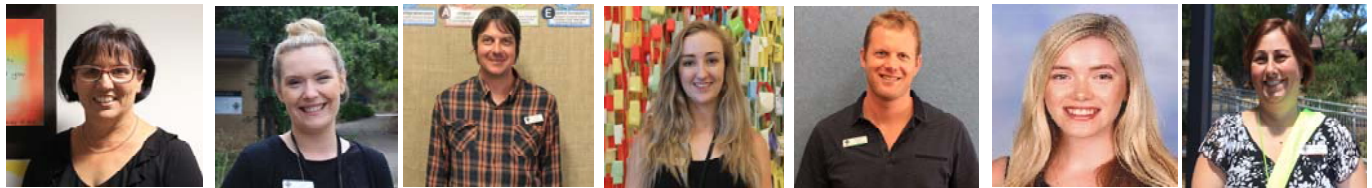

## School crossing and Car Parking around Campus

Well done to the team of 2017 Crossing Monitors who has perform their responsibilities seriously and efficiently since the commencement in Week 1. We would like to remind everyone that speed limits with children around Campus streets are **25km/h** when children are present.

We would also like to remind all parents of the Car Parking and Kiss and Drop Policy that was sent out recently by the principals:

### Staff and Visitor Car Park

- This car park is primarily for staff working at the 3 schools and OSHC
- **Parents ARE NOT to park in the car park** unless visiting during the day for a school related issue
- **NO PARENT OR CAREGIVER** should park here at morning drop off (8.20-8.45am) or after school pick up (3.10- 3.30pm)

### Campus Kiss and Drop

- This is a 2 minute drive in order

to pick up or drop off children. **NO PARKING-** drivers are **not to leave the vehicle**

- Parents should drive to the end point and make sure children only exit and enter the vehicle from the passenger side
- If the child is not there to be picked up, you are to drive through and exit to Campus Drive then come through the Kiss and Drop Zone again

## Performing Arts 2017

2017 will be a busy, exciting year for Performing Arts on Campus. We offer many wonderful opportunities for students in the form of comprehensive classroom Performing Arts lessons, a vibrant Instrumental Music Program, groups/ensembles such as Senior and Junior Choirs, Drama Club, Troupe, and Campus Band, and a multitude of performance opportunities throughout the year that include Campus Fair performances, Instrumental Music Night, Campus Showcase, Adelaide and Southern Music Festivals, and individual school musicals and performances.

### Instrumental lessons



We currently offer Recorder lessons from Year 2, and flute, keyboard/piano, ukulele, guitar, voice, saxophone, clarinet, drums, violin, viola and cello lessons from Year 3 onwards. Instrumental lessons generally start in Weeks 2-3. Our talented Instrumental music teachers demonstrated their instruments to our students at our Instrumental Assembly on Thursday of Week 1. Booklets were handed out to interested students at this assembly, spare copies are in schools.

***Instrumental teachers will be contacting the parents/guardians of commencing students over the next few weeks, once they have received your form.*** If your child missed the assembly or did not bring home a booklet and you are interested in your child learning an instrument (including voice), please drop in to the Campus Office to collect an Instrumental Music Student Information booklet. Likewise, if you have not heard from your child's instrumental teacher by now, please let us know via the Campus Office.

### Bands & Choirs



***Senior and Junior Choirs and Campus Band started rehearsing in Week 3.***

Junior Choir is open to all students in Years 3-5, and Senior Choir to all students in Years 6-7 (compulsory for all Year 6 students). Campus Band is open to suitably skilled students in Years 5-7 – these students must have learnt their instrument for at least a year and be able to read basic notation/chords/tab. To participate, students need to commit to a full year's participation, including performance attendance, and a small fee will be charged to cover resources/transport/ensemble T-shirts, etc. Students are required to attend rehearsals promptly and regularly, and to catch up any class work missed as required. Each ensemble will start with an information session for students in Week 3. ***Rehearsals are held in the PAC as follows: Wednesdays Senior Choir 9.15-10.05am, and Thursdays Campus Band 12.10-12.50pm, Junior Choir 1.30pm- 2.20pm.***

### Drama Club



Our theatrically-minded students will have the opportunity to develop their dramatic skills with the talented Ms Lauren Hood, participating in a range of drama activities and a performance in Term 4. Drama Club is open to Year 5-7 students this year. Administration fees are \$11, and the club will run ***one lunchtime (TBA) in the Performing Arts Centre.*** Students are required to commit to a full year's participation to be involved.

### Campus Troupe

Troupe is open to all Year 5-7 students with an interest in dance, movement and/or choreography. Auditions will be held at the PAC on Friday lunchtime in Week 3, and rehearsals will continue on ***Friday lunchtimes in the PAC*** throughout the year. Performances throughout the year will include Showcase, and school and/or Campus assemblies.

**Notices with information regarding all Ensembles will be sent home at the first rehearsal** – if your child is absent on the day, please collect a notice from the Campus Office. On behalf of the Performing Arts and Instrumental teaching staff, I wish you all a fun and fantastic year of Performing Arts experience!

## Venue for Hire Performing Arts & Media Centre



The Performing Arts & Media Centre is ideal for a wide range of corporate functions and private hires. These might include: *Company planning and training days, workshops or courses, AGMs & meetings, award ceremonies and presentations, exhibition, theatrical productions, screenings, quiz nights, fashion parades and more.*

The auditorium can seat up to 250 people in rows or about 100 around rectangular or circular tables. The stage is large enough to host musicians and choirs or a full theatrical production. There is a fully-equipped modern kitchen with a dishwasher, stove/oven, microwave, fridge and crockery/cutlery and two serveries that cater to the auditorium or outside for alfresco dining.

Parking for up to 50 vehicles is close walking distance and the building is fully wheelchair accessible (even the stage via a wheelchair elevator) with ducted heating and cooling.

The venue caters to all types of audio-visual requirements with a professional sound system including radio microphones, 28 channel audio mixing panel, data projection from CD, iPod, DVD or laptop and presentations can be recorded on HD video. The stage is equipped with several lighting racks and full stage curtaining.
