## Campus Bake Off

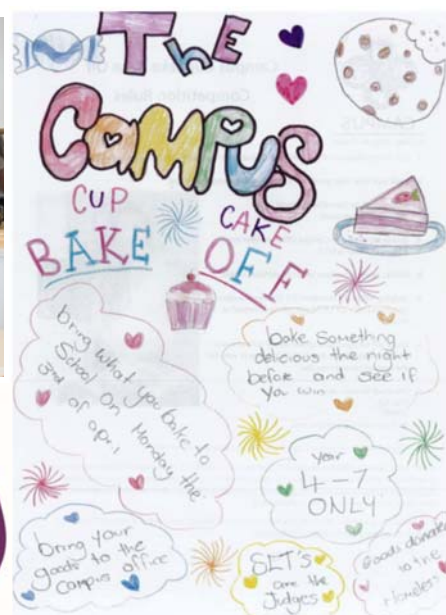
We would like to thank Bree May (MKR winner 2015) for agreeing to help the Student Leadership Team (SLT) judge the Campus Bake Off Challenge.

## Pedal Prix— From Primary School to Community Mentors



The Campus has a long and respected relationship with Pedal Prix in this state and in recent years has gone through a revitalisation of sorts. The sport has changed as technology has found ways to make the trikes stronger and faster.

The Old Scholars Team (OST) program has been a success for both the students, the parents and the Campus. It has kept the knowledge, passion and teamwork all within the one environment which has been looked on by many other school teams as a benchmark to aim for. In 2015 a small but dedicated group of ex Campus riders set about creating their own Cat 4 team with the support of the Campus Pedal Prix committee. They were OST riders whom all started at the Campus as Year 5 riders and still loved the sport.

With some very tenacious fundraising by the riders and their parents a trike was purchased and built by the ex-students and their parents. They were young adults competing against much older and stronger riders but in the last 2 years have become very competitive with the team achieving 10<sup>th</sup> overall in the elite Category 4. The ability to continue involvement in this sport from a junior level all the way through to adulthood is brilliant. The Cat 4 riders operate the team, including the roster, pit changes, repairs and trike maintenance. Not many school based sports can offer that opportunity to continue racing in a community team when they finish primary school.

## Venue for Hire Performing Arts & Media Centre



The Performing Arts & Media Centre is ideal for a wide range of corporate functions and private hires. These might include: *Company planning and training days, workshops or courses, AGMs & meetings, award ceremonies and presentations, exhibition, theatrical productions, screenings, quiz nights, fashion parades and more.*

The auditorium can seat up to 250 people in rows or about 100 around rectangular or circular tables. The stage is large enough to host musicians and choirs or a full theatrical production. There is a fully-equipped modern kitchen with a dishwasher, stove/oven, microwave, fridge and crockery/cutlery and two serveries that cater to the auditorium or outside for alfresco dining.

Parking for up to 50 vehicles is close walking distance and the building is fully wheelchair accessible (even the stage via a wheelchair elevator) with ducted heating and cooling.

The venue caters to all types of audio-visual requirements with a professional sound system including radio microphones, 28 channel audio mixing panel, data projection from CD, iPod, DVD or laptop and presentations can be recorded on HD video. The stage is equipped with several lighting racks and full stage curtaining.
