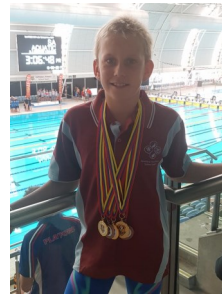


Congratulations to the Campus Teams for participating in the SAPSASA lacrosse recently (pictured left was our Year 4/5 team).

## Cluck! Cluck! Compost! Compost!

In Term 2, the project to build a chook shed and chook run is underway in the Sustainability Garden. Mrs Loffler's class (Reception at Pilgrim) will be introduced to the Henny Penny Hatching program. For this project, we will be teaching children the life-cycle of chickens.

For children in particular, these observations become a major point of discussion, a series of shared experiences which they can verbalise and which will enhance communication on all levels. Teachers who use the program with their students have found a range of educationally relevant ways in which their classes can respond to their individual experiences. These include the creation of drawings, poems, stories, journal entries, oral presentations and more.

Once the chicks are old enough to be independent, they will be transferred to their new home in the chook shed where other Campus students will be responsible for looking after them with supervision.

The Sustainability Garden is looking great with the students from Nativity and Thiele tending to their garden beds. **A reminder to all students to continue to throw their food scraps into the compost bins in the garden so we can fertilise the garden beds.**

### Performing Arts & Media Centre

The Performing Arts & Media Centre is ideal for a wide range of corporate functions and private hires. These might include:

The auditorium can seat up to 250 people in rows or about 100 seated around rectangular or circular tables. The stage is large enough to host musicians and choirs or a full theatrical production. There is a fully-equipped modern kitchen with a dishwasher, stove/oven, microwave, fridge and crockery/cutlery and two serveries that cater to the auditorium or outside for alfresco dining.

Parking for up to 50 vehicles in close walking distance and the building is fully wheelchair accessible (even the stage via a wheelchair elevator) with ducted heating and cooling.

The venue caters to all types of audio-visual requirements with a professional sound system including radio microphones, 28 channel audio mixing panel, data projection from CD, iPod, DVD or laptop and presentations can be recorded on HD video. The stage is equipped with several lighting racks and full stage curtaining.
